NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF APPLICANTS

Under The Council Tax (Reductions for Disabilities) Regulations 1992, a person liable for Council Tax in respect of a property may claim a reduction if there is a resident in the property who is substantially and permanently disabled whether by illness, congenital deformity of otherwise, and that the requirements indicated in section 4 overleaf are essential or of major importance to the well-being of the disabled person by reason of the nature or extent of his or her disability.

The Council will send an Officer to see you, as soon as possible after receiving the completed form.

The Officer will be able to assess the extent of the facilities referred to. However, in certain circumstances we may ask for a letter from a doctor, or other qualified professional such as an occupational therapist or social worker, confirming that the disabled resident needs the extra room or space on which the reduction is being claimed. If such a letter is required, the Council will advise you at the time of the visit or shortly after when the application is being determined.

If you are entitled to a reduction, it will be given by treating your dwelling as if it had been valued in the next lower band. For example, if your property has been valued in Band C, and you are entitled to a reduction, you will be billed as if your property had been valued in Band B. For properties in Band A, the reduction will be equivalent to one sixth of the Band A charge and cannot be applied prior to 1st April 2000.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q: Does the disabled person have to be the person whose name appears on the Council Tax bill?
- **A**: No, the disabled person can be a child, or a relative or friend. However, they must live permanently at the property
- Q: My property is valued in Band A, can I get for a reduction?
- A: Yes, the reduction will be equivalent to one sixth of the Band A charge.
