The Borough of Oadby and Wigston (Off-Street Parking Places) (Variation) (No. 1) Order 2022

NOTICE OF MAKING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN under regulation 17 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended) (“the Regulations”) that Oadby and Wigston Borough Council has made an Order under its powers contained in sections 32 and 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) (“the Act”) the effect of which will be:

1. To make provisions for the Borough of Oadby and Wigston (Off-Street Parking Places) (Variation) (No.1) Order 2022 (“the Variation Order”) to come into operation.
2. To amend the relevant provisions of the Borough of Oadby and Wigston (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2021 (“the 2021 Order”) which applies to all off-street car parks operated by the Council. Save as varied by the Variation Order, the 2021 Order will continue to apply in full force and effect.
3. The variations include, and are applicable to the off-street car parks, as follows:
 - a. To update the 2021 Order to account for legislative changes introduced by the Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022 and the Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Representations and Appeals) (England) Regulations 2022 for all car parks to which the 2021 Order applies;
 - b. To extend the existing provisions contained in the 2021 Order for the introduction, use and enforcement of the parking and charging of electric and hybrid vehicles at Countesthorpe Road Car Park in South Wigston; and
 - c. To change and otherwise clarify the boundary of Parklands Leisure Centre Car Park in Oadby to which the 2021 Order applies.

The Variation Order will come into effect on 1 August 2022.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Variation Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act, the Regulations or of any other instrument made under the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Variation Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

The Variation Order may be examined at the Council Offices, Station Road, Wigston, Leicestershire, LE18 2DR between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm Monday to Friday or can be accessed online on the Council's website at www.oadby-wigston.gov.uk/pages/off_street_parking_places_orders.
