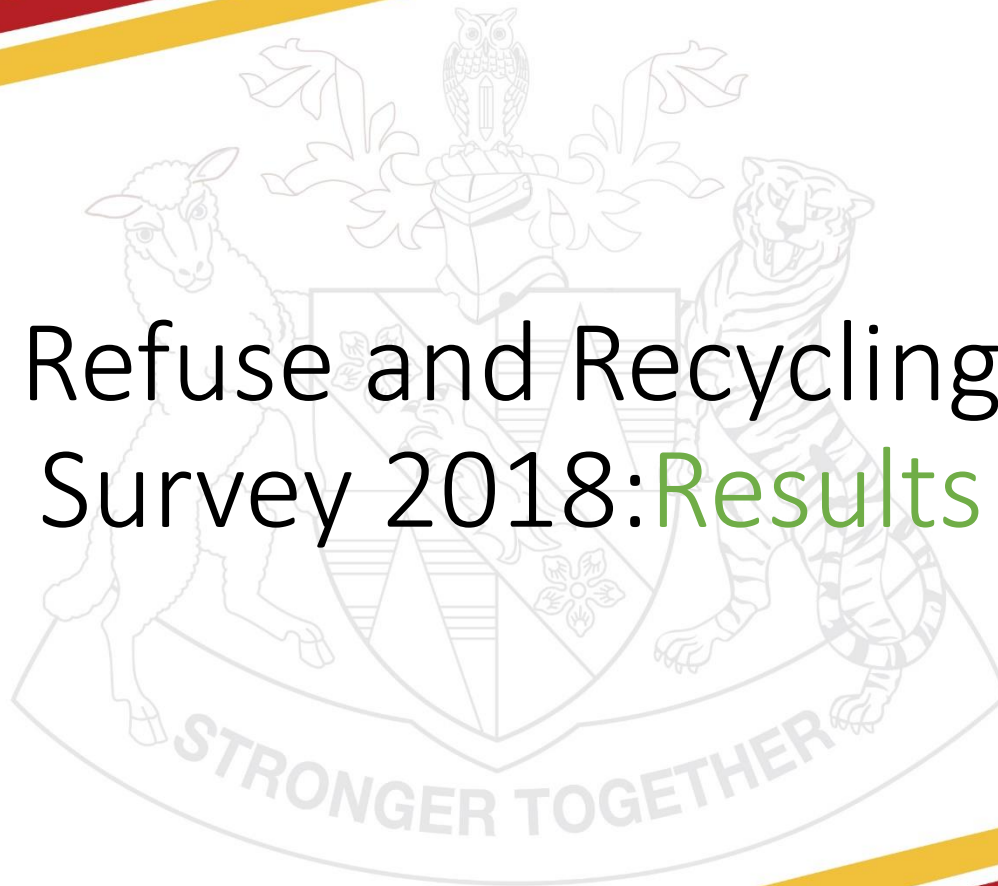
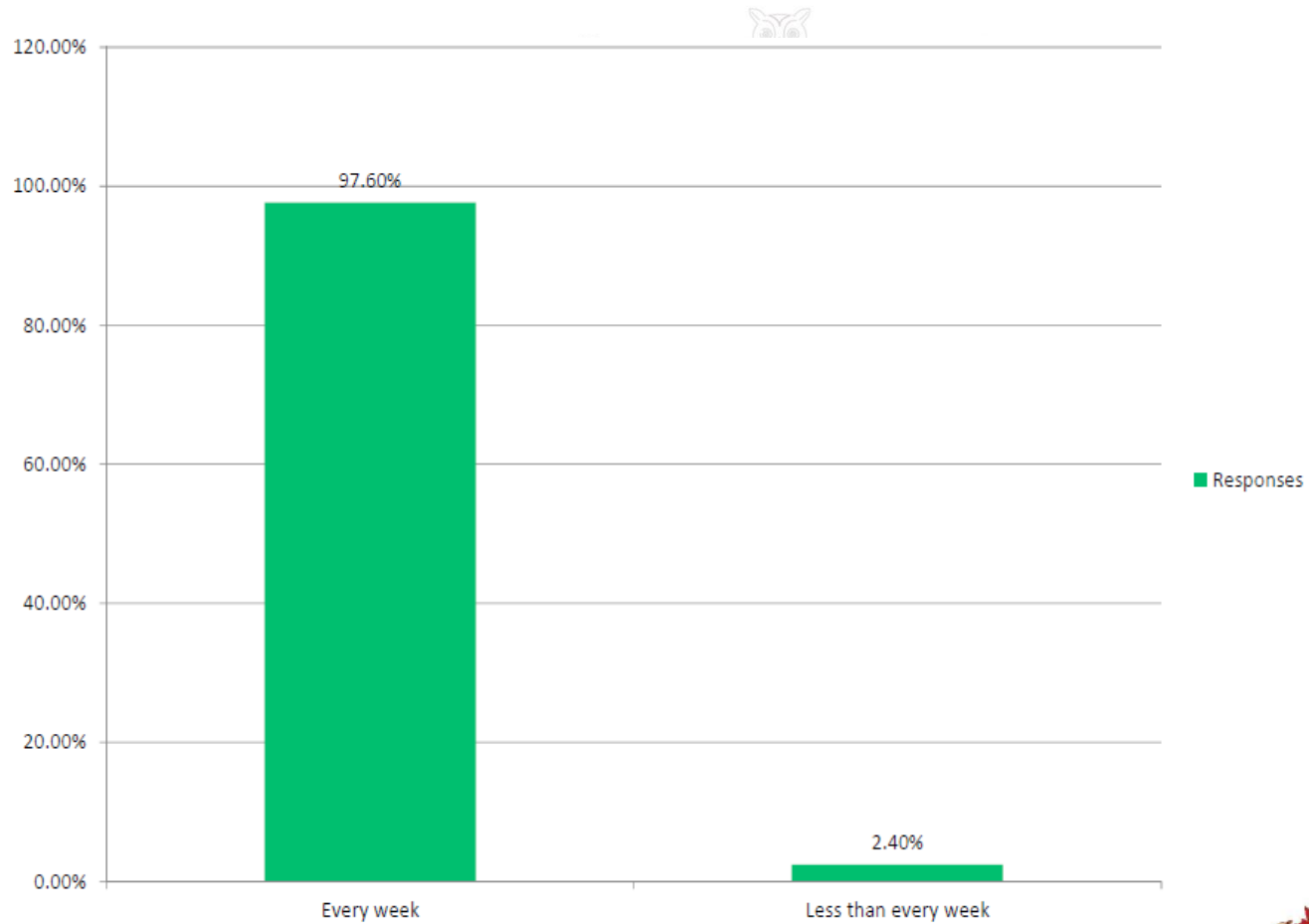


Refuse and Recycling Survey 2018: Results



Q1. How often do you put refuse out for collection?

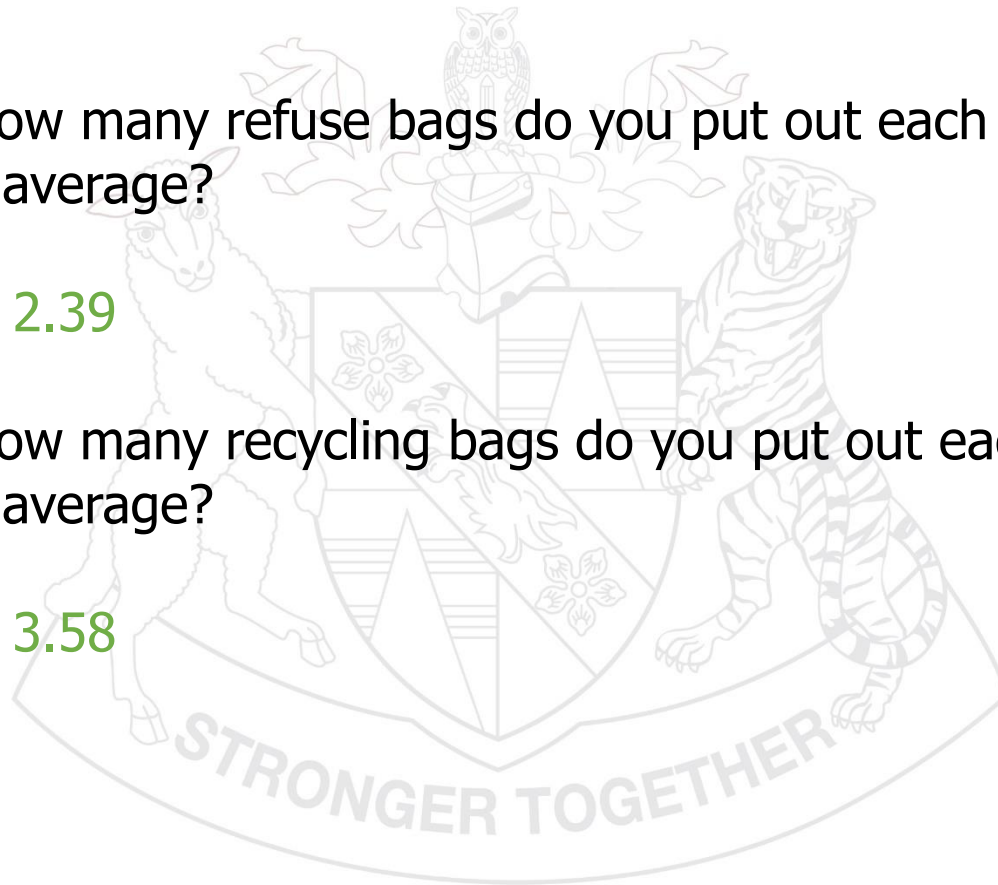


- Q2. How many refuse bags do you put out each week on average?

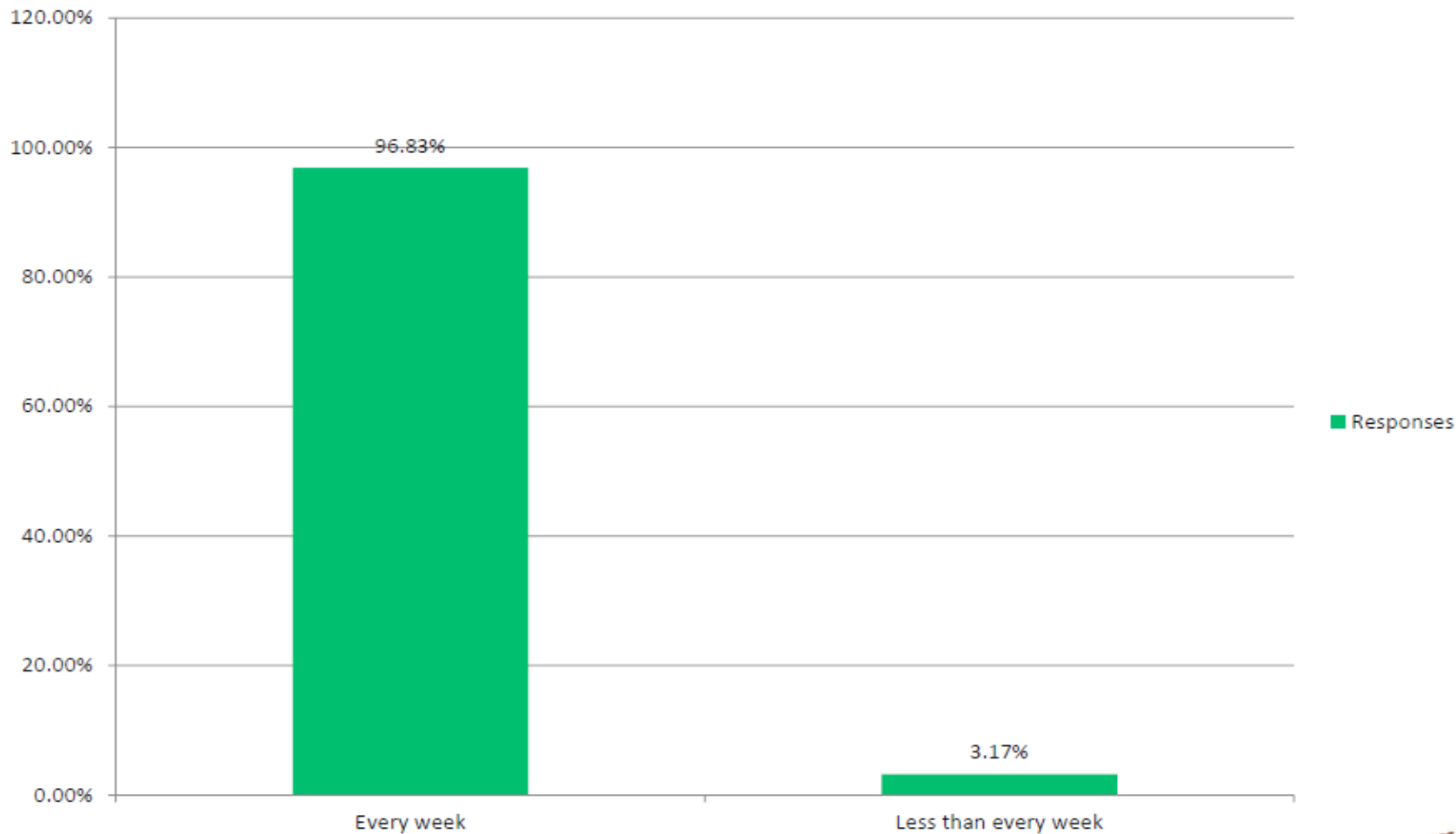
Average: 2.39

- Q6. Number of children aged 4-18 years in the household?

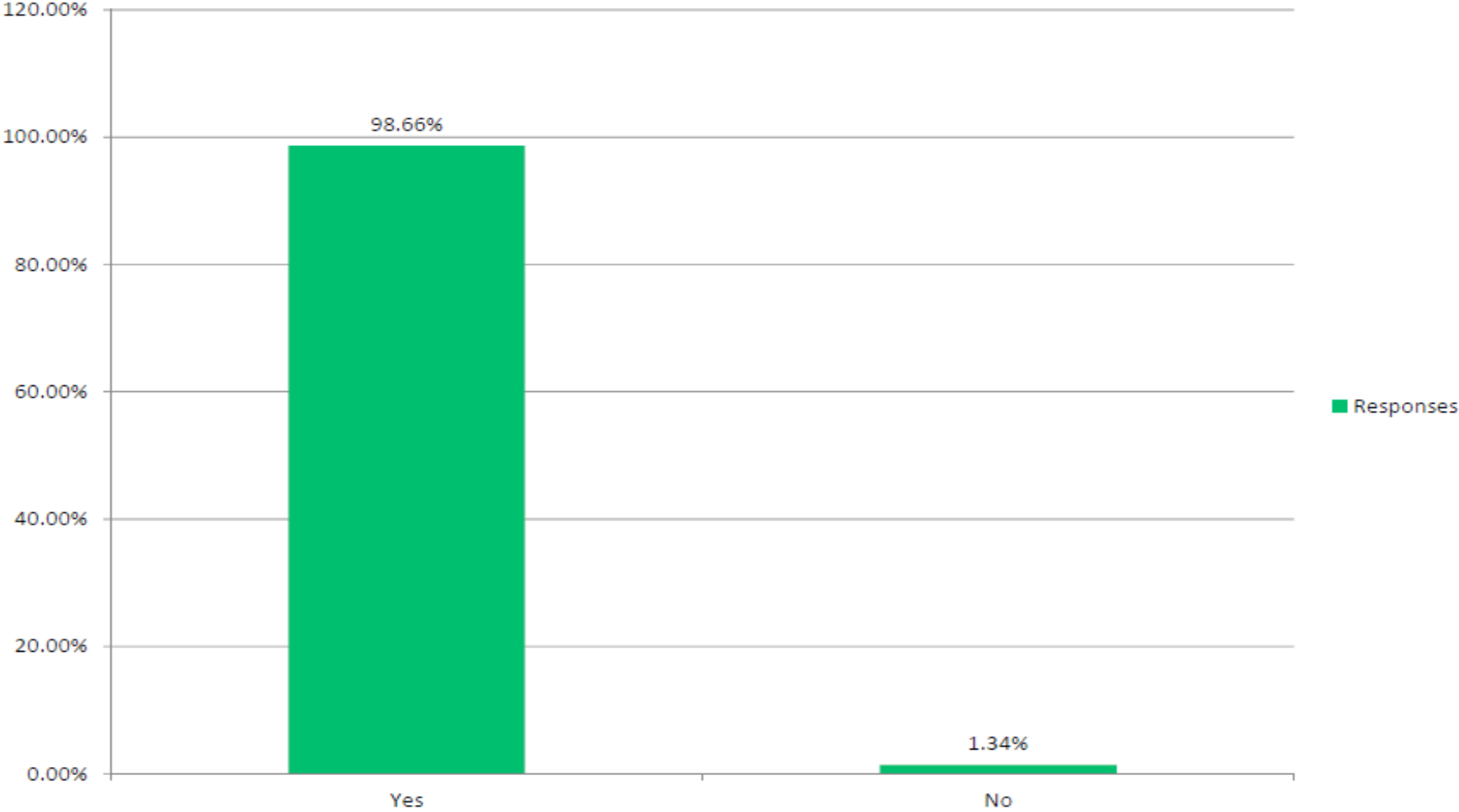

- Q7. Number of children aged 3 years or under in the household?

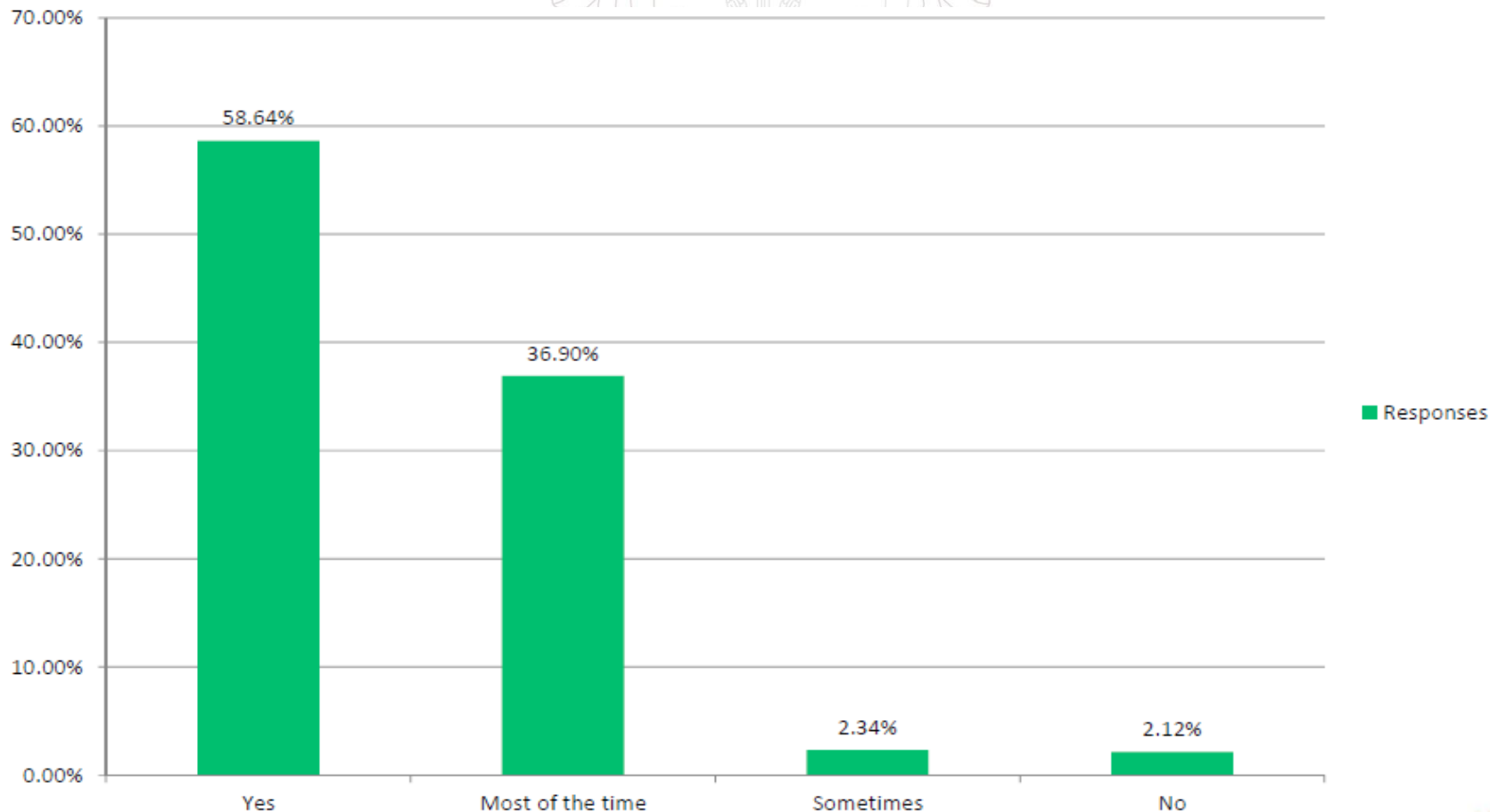

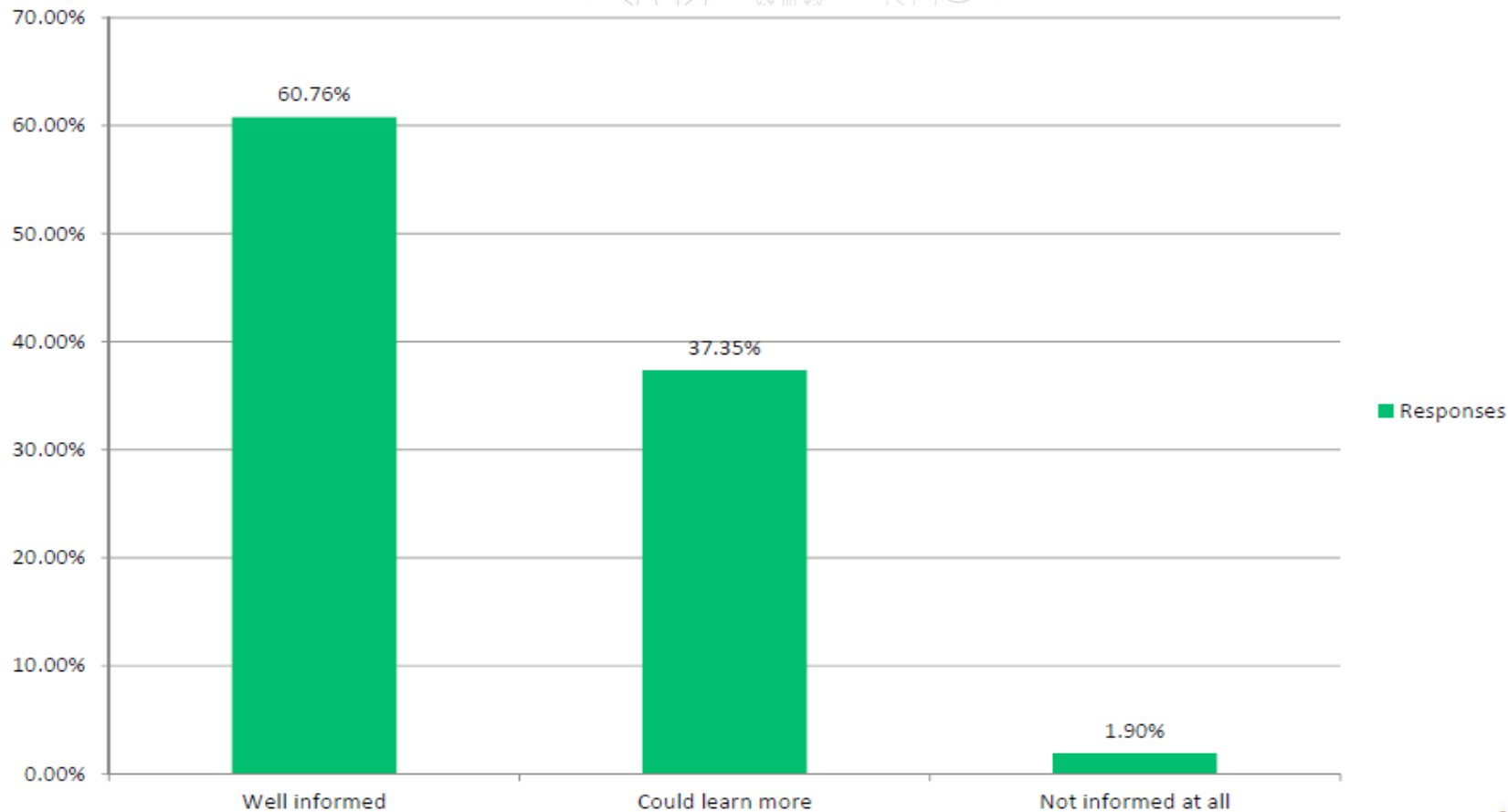
Q8. Do you think it is important to recycle?



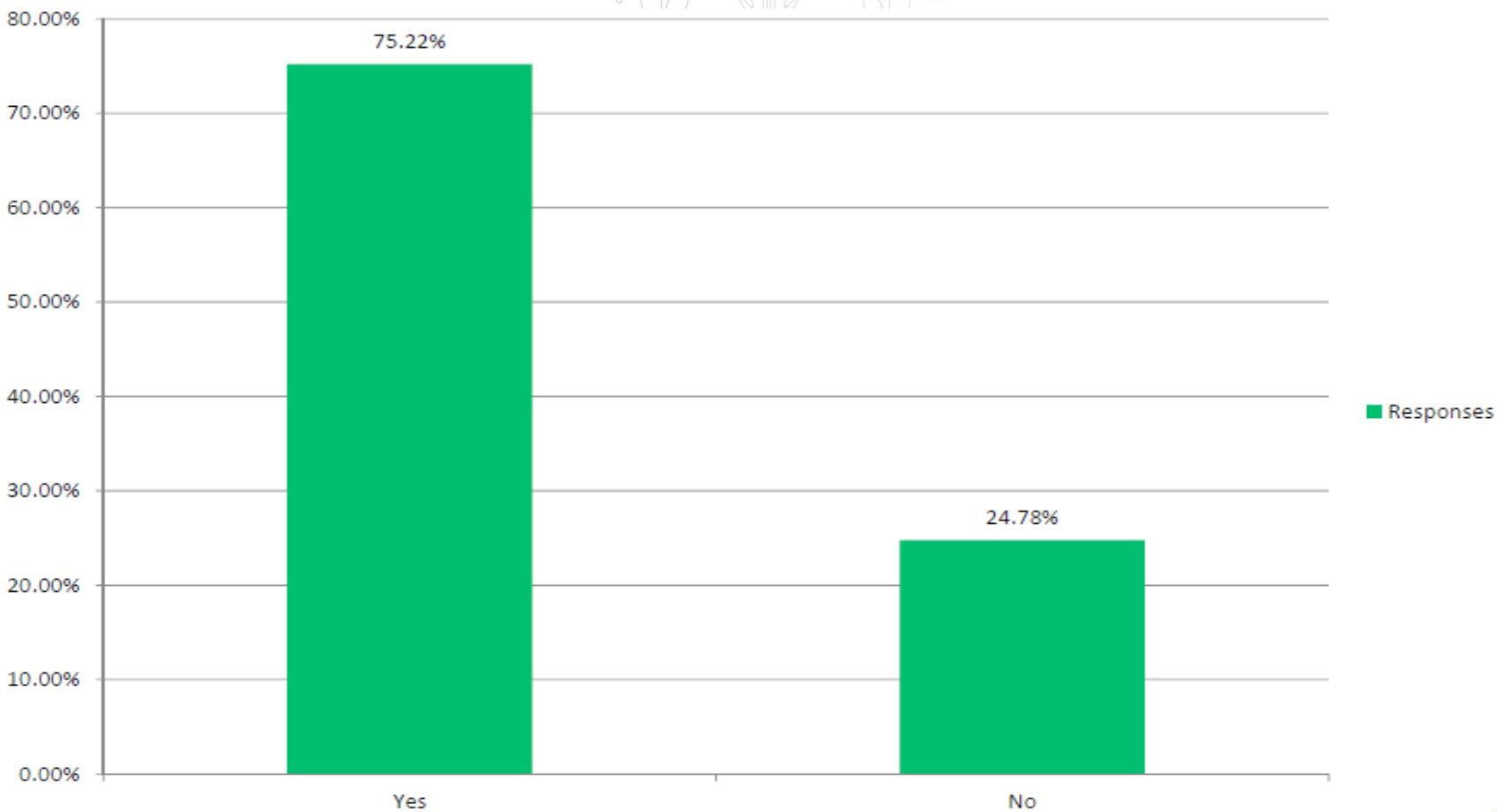
Q9. Are you confident that you only put items in with your refuse that could not be recycled?



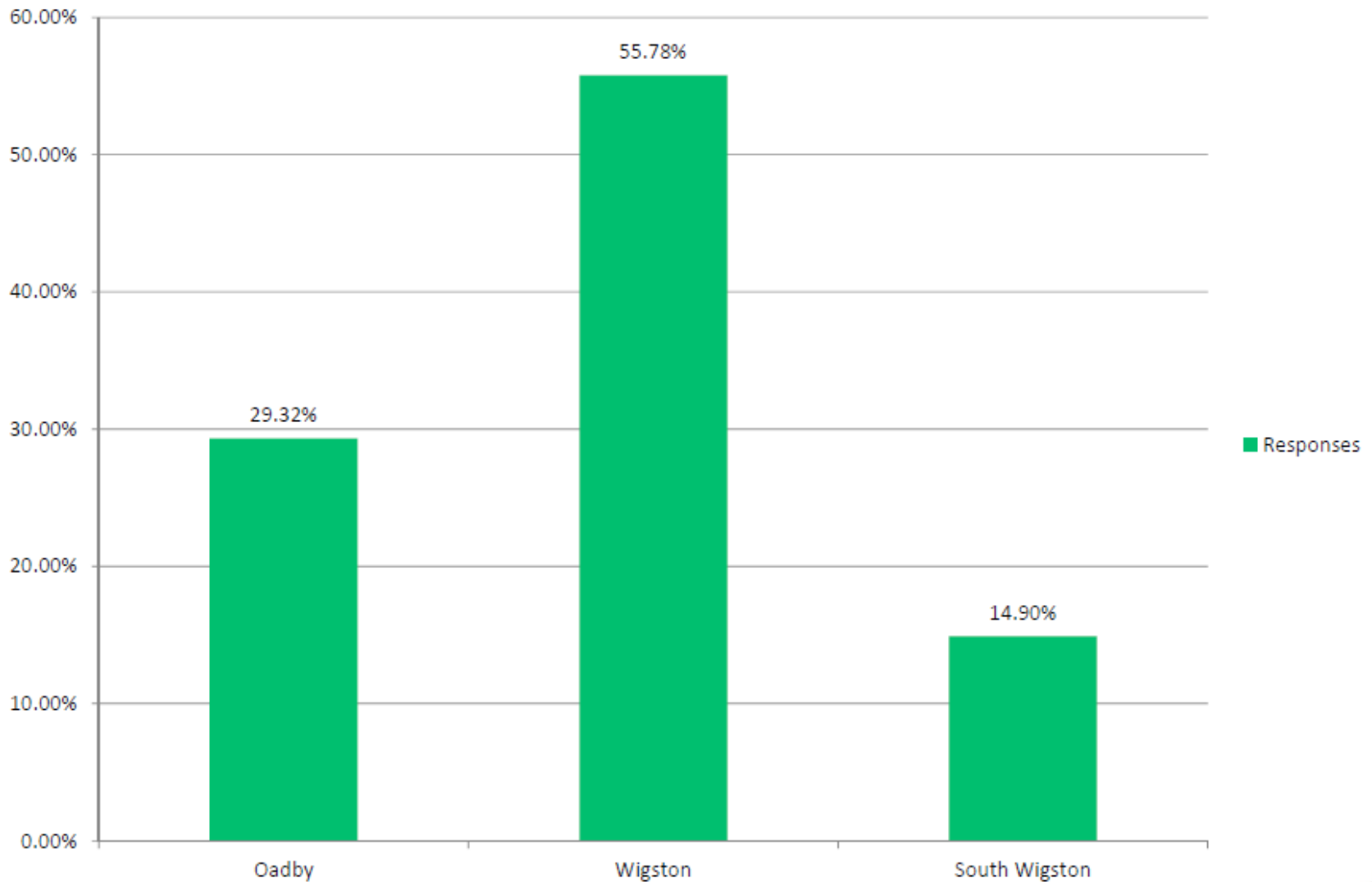
Q10. Do you think you are well informed as to what things can be recycled or could you learn more?
