Councillor Darr and myself would be very much against using Parklands as a polling station for Brocks Hill Ward. Parklands is situated outside the ward boundary and means a long walk for pedestrians from the nearest housing and includes long driveway in the grounds of Brocks Hill.

Other than an election in 2017 there has never been a problem in setting out two polling stations in the main hall at Coombe Park Pavilion. I suggest a meeting there to discuss the layout would be sensible. If after the meeting if it is still thought to be unsuitable can I suggest a second polling station at the church in Rosemead Drive or using Devonshire Court (which has been used in the past).
