Who is eligible to register to vote?

You can register to vote if you are:

- Resident (usually live) in England and aged 16 or over (but you will not be able to vote until you are aged 18).

You must also be either:

- A British citizen or Irish citizen
- A Commonwealth citizen (including Maltese and Cypriot) who has permission to enter or stay in the UK, Channel Islands or Isle of Man, or who does not need permission
- A European Union (EU) citizen of Denmark, Luxembourg, Poland, Portugal, or Spain who has permission to enter or stay in the UK, Channel Islands or Isle of Man, or who does not need permission
- A European Union (EU) citizen of any other EU country who on or before 31 December 2020 had permission to enter or stay in the UK, Channel Islands or Isle of Man, or who did not need permission, and this has continued without a break.

The EU citizens described above can vote in local elections and Police and Crime Commissioner elections, and Mayor of London and London Assembly elections only.

Postal and proxy votes

To arrange to vote by post or by proxy (someone you trust voting on your behalf) you can apply online or download an application form at gov.uk/vote-uk-election.

The open register

The open register is an extract of the electoral register, but it is not used for elections. It can be bought by anyone and used for many purposes including confirming name and address details and direct marketing purposes.

Removing your details from the open register does not affect your right to vote.

PRIVACY STATEMENT The Electoral Registration Officer is the Controller. Their lawful basis for collecting the personal information in this application form is that the processing is necessary in order to perform a task in the public interest as set out in the Representation of the People Act 1983 and related legislation. The Electoral Registration Officer is legally required to process your personal information securely and comply with data protection legislation. If you opted-out of the open register, your name and address can only be used for electoral purposes (including matching it against other data sources to support the electoral register) and other limited purposes specified in law. The law allows your information to be used for democratic engagement activities (by political parties, candidates, and agents), crime detection, jury summoning, and credit application identity checks. If you did not opt-out of the open register your name and address can be bought by anyone and used for lots of purposes, including direct marketing.
